WHAT IS THE POLLINATOR PATHWAY?

The pollinator pathway is a project that has been taken on by 200+ cities to establish pollinator-friendly habitats and food sources for pollinating insects and wildlife in our community. With these gardens, we are not only facilitating nurturing environments for our pollinators to flourish, we are helping to provide wildlife with food and shelter, prevent erosion, keep our waterways cleaner, restore soil health, improve the air we breath, and more.



WHAT'S THREATENING OUR POLLINATORS?

Pollinator populations have been decreasing exponentially due to increased use of pesticides, an increase in invasive species, and the destruction of pollinator habitats.
