Come by Pequot Library to see our latest exhibition, [\*The Book Beautiful: Selections from the Private Press Movement\*](#), on view through Sept. 23. The Private Press Movement was an offshoot of the Arts and Crafts Movement and flourished around the turn of the 19th century. Led by William Morris, its adherents rejected modern, mechanized book production in favor of exquisitely crafted texts and bindings produced using traditional techniques. *The Book Beautiful: Selections from the Private Press Movement* explores this rich period in book design, highlighting fine examples from Pequot Library's Special Collections.

Pequot Library also offers some exciting programs as we round out the summer. Educator and speaker Eric Chandler will lead the last of three lunchtime educational talks about Connecticut's role in the [Revolutionary War](#) on August 8 at 1:00 p.m. Chandler has spoken at libraries and museums across New England, paying particular attention to the minutiae of Connecticut's military contributions and participation. Registration is capped at ten participants per session, and this session costs \$25 (\$20 for library members).

Finally, Pequot Library presents many ongoing monthly and weekly programs for children, including Dungeons & Dragons and Babes on a Blanket.
