**Pequot Library, Fairfield  
Fairfield County**

Pequot Library Association was founded in 1894 by Virginia Marquand Monroe; the library itself was designed by architect Robert Henderson Robertson and opened in 1894. Pequot has many unique and distinct features: columns and arches marking the main entrance, a recognizable Ludovici red-tiled roof, and a beautiful stone facade, which make it a beautiful example of late nineteenth-century public architecture in the Romanesque-Revival style. Expanded first in 1898, with iconic ironwork stacks, glass-tile floor, and Tiffany windows, the library is included in the National Register of Historic Places.
