Severe Weather Advisory

Weather Update 10-26-2018

Fairfield is expected to be impacted by a strong Nor'easter later this evening (Friday) continuing into Saturday Afternoon.

What to Expect:

Winds will begin to increase later this evening out of the Northeast becoming heavy and sustained in the 25-35 MPH range with gusts possible in the 35-40 MPH range.

Rain will begin to fall later today and continue until sometime Saturday afternoon. 1-2 inches of rain is possible in the Fairfield area.

What should you do?

- All residents should prepare for heavy sustained winds. Secure all items outside that may be affected by winds (Lawn furniture, Barbeque Grilles, Toys)
- Be prepared for downed power lines and possible power outages.
- If you live along the coast (Fairfield Beach area) or low lying areas that are known to flood easily prepare your home for flooding. Coastal areas could experience significant flooding during high tide periods. 1-2 feet of coastal inundation is expected for a period of 12-24 hours.

Current Weather Advisories and Warnings:

Coastal Flood Warning has been issued for Southwestern Connecticut (Including Fairfield) and low lying areas that are prone to flooding.
